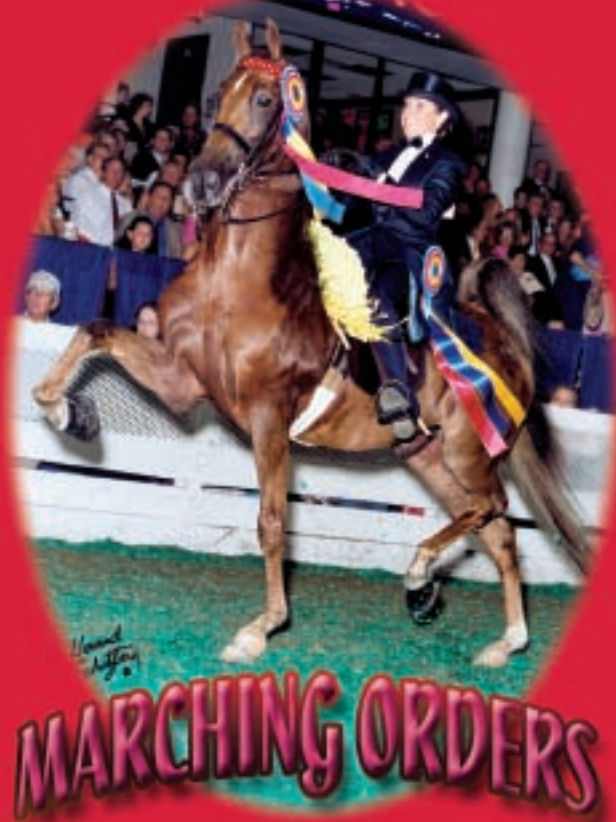

In keeping with a long-standing tradition, horses belonging to the Goodman and Manilow families have graced the front cover of Saddle & Bridle's "Louisville Bound" issue for more than 25 years. Some of the grand horses that have been featured on our August covers include: CH Lady Luck BG, CH Boo!, CH Callaway's Sugarplum, CH CF First Light Of Dawn, Impressive's First Lady, CH Meadowlark Lady, CH Lady Magic, Will's Lady Kate, and CH Lady's Favorite Event.

Throughout this time, the Goodman and Manilow horses have been trained by Richard Obenauf Stables in McHenry, Illinois.

On this month's cover, we are pleased to present the wonderful World's Champion Three-Gaited gelding, Marching Orders. This son of Merchant Prince and out of a CH Caramac daughter, has been a World's Champion from his first start out of the gate when he was crowned a World's Champion in the Two-Year-Old Three-Gaited Division II back in 2003 with Tré Lee presenting. It was during this class that he was selected by trainer John Conatser for his customer Elizabeth Deknatel's High Hickory Farm, and he continued on to successes at Louisville the following year as a three-year-old and he claimed the UPHA Three-Year-Old Three-Gaited Classic Championship title at the American Royal.

He was purchased the following spring by Charles H. Goodman as a mount for his daughter, Barbara Manilow. Barbara and "Marty" have continued their winning ways with style and grace. This well-known duo has taken championship after championship, including the Ladies Three-Gaited World's Championship in 2005 and 2006. 2007 saw two Reserve titles in the Ladies division before a great start to 2008 at FASH and Midwest Charity, which has netted them three out of three Amateur Three-Gaited wins.

In addition to Marty, others from the Goodman and Manilow families that will be attending the World's Championship Horse Show in 2008 will be: Barbara's new acquisition, Red Flame Thrower, for the Amateur Five-Gaited division; 2007 World's Champion Three-Year-Old Three-Gaited and Reserve World's Grand Champion Three-Gaited, Glenview's Excelalante, for the Ladies Three-Gaited division; Callaway's Exception To The Rule, the new Five-Gaited Juvenile mount for Barbara's young daughter, Maya (this mare is also eligible for the Gaited Pony division, where she is a past World's Champion); and CH CF First Light Of Dawn, who will be competing in his final Louisville experience with Maya. "Danny", as he is affectionately known, was a World's Champion in Show Pleasure 13 and Under in 2007, in addition to his many other titles in Equitation. This popular team will be competing in the Juvenile Country Pleasure division, and they were recently named the Juvenile Grand Champions at Midwest Charity from a field of 19 horses shown. Maya will also be astride the handsome 2006 and 2007 World's Champion, The Majestic, who is to be her Show Pleasure mount for the competitive 13 and Under age bracket.

Also to be showcased at the World's Championship under the ownership of the Goodman and Manilow families are Lady Bravada, who is an exceptional Junior Fine Harness entry by Attaché's Royal Assets and out of the dam of WC CH Tamarack's Lightning Strikes, who will be shown in the Junior Mare class by Richard Obenauf. Associate trainer Kenny Smith will be presenting the spiffy Junior Gaited entry, Battle's Radar, who is kin to CH Boo! Battle's Radar has already been in the winner's circle in 2008 at the FASH and Madison Classic Horse Shows.
