are not participating in the horse business. Marlene LaFleur continues, "With the Bratfest going on at Willow Island on the grounds, more than 208,000 brats were sold. The Madison Marathon was also held the Sunday, May 24th which brought an additional 6,000 racers, plus relatives and friends to the grounds." For the price of a little inconvenience to us, we were able to show many people our grand horses. And, that is something that we can, and should be able, to handle!

Moving the show up to the Arena building also sets the show smack dab in the center of the pretty parkway with trees and picnic tables, along with Marty and Terry Bennett's Tack Shop trailer right there. Longtime show attendee and Saddlebred exhibitor, Claudia Luidens Olejniczak has been coming to Madison for many years from her homestate in Michigan, regardless of whether she is showing there or not. She and her husband, Paul, did so again in 2009 and said after the show, "I love the show in the Arena building, and hope it stays there." Her reason is simple. "It's so much easier. You can sit and watch horses warm up or you can go a short few steps inside and watch the class that is already underway."

Another feature of the Madison Show that was getting people excited about going to the ring and actually watching the class was the incentive Jackpot Judging. For the mere price of a \$5 ticket, you try to match the judge du jour who in this year's case was Birthday Girl Melinda Moore's picks for 1st thru 6th places. With no winner

"You can't buy this type of publicity for our breed," said lifelong Wisconsin horsewoman Marlene LaFleur, when referring to the numbers of people who were on the Alliant Center grounds for the Madison Classic Horse Show.

LaFleur's daughter, Liv Moyer, has been managing the show for four years now. 2009 brought some changes for the longtime Midwestern show, which has been named the UPHA Honor Show for Chapters 3/4 numerous times. "Due to the recession, we decided to downsize some of the expenses. We went from three judges to one and we also moved the show from the coliseum back to the Arena building. We are well aware that these changes caused some to make alternate plans, but overall we were thrilled with the response to the show."

Reflecting a nationwide trend for horse shows this season, the performance classes were not the "bread and butter" of the show, as that title was taken by the Park and Pleasure horses. Moyer continued, "I am not sure people who come to these shows are aware of the huge expense to rent the facilities. In order to be in the coliseum, we would double our rental of the Dane County/Alliant Center facility and we just figured that we didn't want to be left in the red."

This is what many shows are encountering on a national level. What made the 2009 Madison Classic a great venue for the breed, is something that we often forget about, and that is exposure of our wonderful show horses and ponies to those who

on Friday, Saturday or Sunday, the total purse of \$1015 was paid out to those closest to Moore's actual picks. Those lucky recipients, Jason Gershman (who also won the Country Pleasure Five-Gaited qualifier and Stake with the sporty Alpha Priority) and area professional Lance Hayes each went home with some \$507 a piece. That's surely better than a poke in the eye! And what a great way to keep people at the show RAILSIDE and WATCHING intently. It makes people part of it. As I was selling tickets for the Jackpot Judging those three days, one woman who had come from the Arab show noted to me that the Arab show was really dead with the enrollment there in Milwaukee down and the spectators even more so. She commended the Madison Classic Show for doing something to get people involved with the show!

Luckily, the weather only "rained on the parade" during non-horse showing hours. Saturday evening following the show, there was a nice exhibitors' party with entertainment held for the first time in the Exhibitors' Hall, adjacent to the show grounds.

Saturday afternoon, after the session's classes, which were indeed a long day with the well-filled Academy division requiring four classes to be split and all those were judged by Jay Wood of Plato, Minn, the ASAW Youth Scholarship program held a "Chuck a Duck" contest. (Why do I think of Ernie from Sesame Street fame?). The goal is to toss or "chuck", if you will, said duck into a hula hoop that has been strategically placed somewhere in the ring. The lucky "duck" who came closest and took home the nearly \$400 purse home (half going to the ASAW Youth Scholarship) was exhibitor and "country doctor" Laura Sukowaty of New Berlin, Wisc.

Again in 2009, the Breast Cancer Recovery Foundation is the charitable organization of the Madison Classic Horse Show. Saturday night, a Pink Ribbon Ladies Gaited Stake was held and many show officials and attendees were, in fact, wearing pink for the occasion. Show manager Liv Moyer, herself a breast cancer survivor, says of

this worthwhile foundation, "They are a local Madison based group who offer retreats for breast cancer survivors. I always feel that the breast cancer survivor is somewhat ignored in the scheme of the disease itself. Like we need to just move on and never acknowledge that we are survivors. The Breast Cancer Recovery Foundation takes care of the brave women who have fought a good fight."

The really expressive and big-doing Three-Gaited gelding Cataclysmic continued his winning ways with owner Susan Halverson in the irons. By Catalyst, and trained by Terri Anne Ullman, "Leo" roared into the ring for the Ladies qualifier and stake titles after a season warm up at FASH just a few weeks earlier. The debuting damsels Callaway's Rosemary & Thyme, by Callaway's Blue Norther, and Ashley Baird made their first juvenile class of this five-year-old mare's career and it's apparent that this will be a team to watch in 2009, as

directed by Pat McConnell. Sandy Bernd and Born Independent made a strong showing in the Open and Stake outings under the direction now of LaFleur Stables for the nod therein. It's always so great to see Sandy showing and at the show with her mom, Joann, as they have been a team at the show for more than 35 years. Shades of Valley View's Highland Heather — oh the memories!

John Willis debuted some really neat youngsters, if not debuted, he has them more finely tuned. The sporty and swan-necked The Camera Man, who is by Merchant Prince and out of CH Take My Picture, presented this nice horse to the UPHA Three-Year-Old Three-Gaited title, and now has him qualified for harness or under saddle come Kansas City time. Many will remember Take My Picture to have been shown by Kris Frye Knight, and ironically it was Kriss' aunt and uncle, Eleanor and Bob Killerlain that ran the Madison "Charity" Horse Show for many years — and that was the predecessor to the Madison Classic. John also had the really big, strong-going Miracle On Broadway, who is a full brother to the lovely Miracle on Forty Second Street whom John won a World's Championship title with in the Two-Year-Old Mare Fine Harness a few years back. This big drink o' water is owned by John's longtime client Callie Davidson. After a nice win of the Novice class with John presenting, Callie and "Mick" stepped forth for the Wisconsin Owned nod wherein many of their adoring fans were railside to see a victory pass where the horse raised up and squatted down — "ohmylawd!", as John always says with such southern eloquence.

Linda Goodrich continued the winning ways that she established earlier this season at the Mid America Spring Show, as directed by Neva LaFleur. The big and pretty-bodied mare Kenya Ketch Me, by Reedann's Top Gun, was the Ladies qualifier and stake winner, just as she was at Mid America with Linda presenting. Linda also was elated to step with her rackin' machine Aim For The Stars into the Open division at Marlene and Neva's urgence for that win of the qualifier. Come Stake time, it was Kenya's paternal brother, as shown by Pat McConnell for Dr. Kyla Womack Tremper, namely Reedann's Top Notch

whose pretty flaxen coloring and correctness shined through for the Bill Matton Memorial Perpetual Trophy in the Open Five-Gaited Stake. McConnell also had the winning bid with the real good-thinking four-year-old Champagne Caramac whom MBA Equestrian's client Carole Bart had recently purchased via A.J. Bruwer. Carole has been a member of the Saddle Horse community for more than 30 years as evidenced by such past stars as Call Me Sir, Denmark's Country Boy, and The Lady Prefers — the latter is the dam of WC Harlem's Santa Fe. I think it's a safe bet that within a short period of time, we'll see Carole on this nice horse that they call "Mikey" (he does seem to "like everything").

Black gaited horses shined through at Madison Classic. Ray Krussell debuted his fiancé Wendy Carney's parents' (Miles and Elizabeth) new horse Brookhill's Nite Shift whom they acquired via Melissa Moore. Nite Shift, by CH Harlem Town, debuted in the UPHA Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited class with Ray presenting. Diana Schaefer's mount of several years, The Midnight Hero, a really handsome black horse, just seems to be getting better and better with age. "Tux" stepped forth to the Amateur Five-Gaited Stake tricolor for the second year in a row at Madison Classic. Diana sits a horse so correctly, nary moving a muscle at the rack and slow gait! Last year's Open

Gaited Stake winner, Sensational Charm, with owner/rider Sarah Thordsen, who took some time from her doctorate studies to show her energetic mare, was the Amateur qualifier winner. This pair graced the front cover of the 2009 Madison Classic Horse Show program. Reserve Grand Championship title in that nice Amateur Stake went home with the multiple geared, Keep Me Posted, an oft winner in the area and also a past winner in the Junior division at Louisville. Jean Ann Gundersen and "Charlie" seem to have really tapped into each other after a winter's work at LaFleur Stables.

Heather Linzmeier and the gifted Catalyst daughter, She's Amber Delight, were a tough act in the Junior Fine Harness class for longtime Saddlebred owner, Doris Thorwald, a gracious lady indeed. Pat Wessel capably presented the lofty black three-year-old Royal Crest's Rhinestone Cowboy for Bruce and Rusty Rademann's Royal Crest Farm. This able three-year-old won the UPHA Fine Harness class and is sired by the Rademann's stallion, Seaheart, who is a full brother to CH X's & O's and CH Black Mountain Buck.

Park and Pleasure horses, as mentioned earlier, seem to be saving the horse show industry from extinction in this tough economy. These classes were chock full of good ones! Demi's Dark Design, by Designed and

out of the former pleasure show mare Demi Deker, took the Open Park Class with trainer Neva LaFleur up for owner Ingrid Klongland. This nice mare had a great season in 2008, and has now one a class at each of her three shows already this season. Coco Loco, after many years in the Fine Harness division, made his Park Horse debut with trainer Mark Utoft in the irons at Des Moines where he won the Park qualifier and Stake, and now also added the Park Stake title to his resume for owners Candace and Fritz Meili. The Meilis had a winning weekend at Madison and also celebrated daughter, Corbin Smith's 25th birthday with an informal gathering of friends by the Utoft Stables stalls after the show on Saturday nite. Corbin herself was in the winner's circle at Madison with the real expressive and fronty Gaited pleasure horse Walterway's Believe In Me who was a winner with her at Mid America Spring in their debut together. Corbin also capably presented the colorful Last Cat Standing, by Catalyst, to the Adult Show Pleasure Stake title in a field of nine participants, defeating the likes of the handsome and amiable combination of Beth Bidon Krueger and Pierre Cardin, last year's Wisconsin Futurity Show Pleasure Stake winners. Pierre Cardin won an impressive 11 horse 39 and Over qualifier just the night before the stake. Neva LaFleur presented Hendrickson's Horses real upheaded Royal Crest's Freedom Rocks to the Open English Pleasure qualifier and Stake in "Carlos" first time back in the show ring in two years.

Juvenile Park is a growing division, undoubtedly having something to do with its recently being added to the schedule at Louisville! Duh! Pretty Breanna Lukan had the really neat Open Park mare (then shown by her trainer Jay Wood) The Paper Princess JJW wavin' her legs for the nod in the Juvenile Park qualifier. Amateur Park classes were well-filled with some real rompin', stompin' teams, but none could out-do the extreme motion of CH SA Nelmar's Tango 4 Ever and Emily Scharpft in the eyes of Judge Moore. This Knollwood directed pair claimed both qualifier and stake titles to make for a great start to their competitive '09.

Park Pleasure had some really sporty individuals on display as Tom Thorpe presented King Of Pop whom they had recently selected from the Durants'

Bell View Acres for customer Barbara Fahey. "Pop-Tart", as he is known, was the Park Pleasure Open winner with Tom presenting. Park Pleasure Stake saw the long-necked five-year-old mare, Glinda The Good, bewitchingly loft down from above in her glass bubble to be tapped with the royal scepter of the tricolor with trainer Rick Wallen presenting for Janene Steggeman. Amateur Park Pleasure found an elated Dr. Leslie Kordecki and her much loved Wild Surmise, by Santana Safari, making their second victory pass of the '09 season under the direction of John Willis.

Youngsters such as Opportunist, a/k/a "3 Socks", by Sir William Robert and out of the former World's Champion of Champions Pleasure horse, CH Meadowlark Lady, continued his winning ways with trainer Terri Anne Ullman in the irons for Barbara Goodman Manilow in the UPHA Three-Year-Old Park Pleasure event, after a warm up win at FASH. Junior Park Pleasure saw the real cocky and ears-up Ro & Me's Satori, by Trust Fund and out of the former show mare Turlington, undeniably a presence for the win for Amy Weiler. Weiler's buttons were burstin', and that gave her a nice diversion from her recent knee surgery, when her son Garrett brought down the house in the Country Pleasure 13 and Under class with his recent acquisition, Salt Heir. Garrett and the sharp bay pleasure

driving pony, Honest Impression were undefeated at Madison '08, all directed by Mayo Moctezuma.

Gotta Be Charmed and Nancy Leigh Fisher seem to really be the "comeback kids". Making their mark in the Gaited Pleasure division, they came back and won the Championship now at two shows — Bonnie Blue and Madison Classic. This class at Madison was a nice field of nine participants and was the selected Jackpot Judging class wherein a payout of \$1015 was paid to two lucky winners. Juvenile Gaited Pleasure saw Knollwood's double whammy of youth riders rackin', namely Katie Koeppel and The Whole Town's Talkin' taking the qualifier and then stake honors going to recent FASH winners Loretta Mulberry and He's Heirisistible. Knollwood also had winning honors in the Junior Show Pleasure qualifier and stake when the poppy-eyed and expression-filled Mojito was again minty and refreshing with Sarah Lindner in the irons. M&N's Buck Almighty, by CF First Night Out and out of the former gaited show mare Lady Skybuck, showed his willingness and style for the Reserve Grand Championship with happy former educator and current real estate mogul Nina Kraus in the irons for All Things Horsey.

Show Pleasure Driving saw another continued "FASH" success story when gentlemanly Douglas Fiola dapperly presented his versatile CH Will's No

Doubt About It to the qualifier and Stake wins under the direction of Jared Ratzloff. "Willie" as the veteran show gelding is known also took FASH's Five Gaited Pleasure Stake title with Fiola's niece Jessica Timmington in the irons. This is one dandy horse! Reserve Championship title going to another horse who's won a class at each of her 3 shows thus far this season, DLF's Last Investment, as shown by Adult equitator Constance MacQueen. Country Pleasure Driving saw a near clean sweep of the "rolling stock" for trainer Jared Ratzloff who's customer Donna Beck (a longtime member of the midwestern Saddle horse contingency) capably presented the light chestnut Carissimo to the qualifier in that division. Country Pleasure Driving Stake going home with the veteran show horse Another Great Day with Lucinda Rhea at the lines for owner Robyn O'Meara and trained by Ray Krussell.

Show Pleasure Juvenile saw such outstanding teams as Maya Manilow and The Majestic who were continuing their winning ways started earlier this season at FASH, and trained by Kenny Smith at Obenauf Stables. They came in for just one class at Madison and did not show back. Championship honors in that 13 and under age bracket going home with the veteran LaGuardia and Eva Heniges, as directed by the Martalock sisters. 14-17 honors were the property of the marchin' CH Fine by Me and Alicia Sacotte who also took this same title at Mid America Spring by taking their championship there as proud grandparents Scott & Carol Jandrain looked on. "Tucker" was the 14-17 Stake winner also, as directed by Ginger Schinktgen who also trains the "never say die" Fine Harness horse, Oban who was 4-for-4 with owner Phil Meyer at the lines.

Novice Riders and Novice Horses always have their "due" at Madison Classic. Mya Moyer, daughter of show manager Liv Moyer was the Novice Rider Show Pleasure 17 & Under when riding 20 year old CH Bright Wind. The Adult Novice Rider saw the silvery haired young lady Mary Yonker atop the flaxen haired Worthy Son-in-Law for the nod and owned by Susan Bekenstein. Country Pleasure Novice Rider events were both taken home by horses in residence at Winsome Farm Saddlebreds when veteran show gelding CH Sand Kalamehameha and Bevan Sukowaty were the kids class

"Merlin" also nicely suited eye-care professional Connie MacQueen, who is having a WHOLE lotta fun this season in Pleasure Driving, Adult Pleasure and now Equitation. Allison Schuh has her own new mount in 2009 to tackle and learn the process with. Frequent Country Pleasure winners Alyssa Mitchell and Deker's All American, ventured victoriously into the Equitation realm for a Maiden Pleasure nod from Judge Moore. Moriah's Cat Nip, a full brother to gaited winner Aim For The Stars, and Pleasure World's Champion He Walks On Water (CH) showed familial loyalties and similarities for the win with pretty and able young Brynn Lunas, who rides with the sisterly training team of the Martalock gals. Accomplished Deanna Lanigan and her well-known Oh What A Feeling continued their impressive winning streak, which netted them a WC title in 2009.

winner and Adults found determined Fay O'Meara in the irons aboard her pretty Midnight Love Son, sired by Midnight Capp O'Cino. Word has it that trainer Jimmy Orphanos was so happy that he shed some tears following this nice win. Wisconsin Owned Pleasure was a five horse field including the winning act of "May birthday girl" Kerry Honkamp upon Final Deklaration, who as his name would indicate is the last offspring sired by the late Andeker.

Country Pleasure 14-17 saw the handsome coppery red chestnut Majestic's Wingmaster, by Yorktown Magic, and Gracie Grabower making an imposing team for that win and the Stake title under the direction of Sheri Brandl's Equitate LLC for owner and proud grandmother, Elaine Richmond. Adult Country Pleasure honors in the qualifying round saw the really neat team of Sarah Worzalla Luft and The Bourne Supremacy in the winning

mode and the Stake title going home with the catch-riding "mom to be" Piper Granger Bordegon and the veteran Jedidiah.

Western and hunt saw some more veterans continuing their winning ways for their owners. AF Colour Creation, a/k/a "Romeo", took pride when his "Juliet" Megan Mahoney Novak took him to the Hunter Seat Open and Saddle & Bridle Hunter Seat classic wins, in addition to a nice Reserve Adult Country Stake title with Worthy One's Party Dude, all directed by Country Meadow Farm. 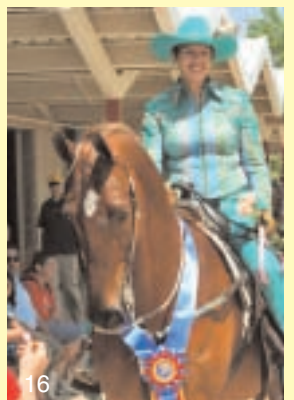
